## ACCESS TO LEARNING

To accommodate students' needs, courses are offered in a variety of delivery methods:

### **Evening Courses**

Evening courses are generally one three-hour lecture weekly. The taught component of each course is six weeks (9 weeks for DipPL 300 courses). Refer to the timetable at the end of the Prospectus for dates and times of the teaching component of the courses. Note that the course completion date is when assignments have been marked and returned which is usually eight weeks after the last lecture.

### **School Break/Block Courses**

Block courses are held during school break periods and/or weekends. Block courses have the same number of teacher contact hours as evening courses in the three or four days of teaching. The course completion date is usually eight weeks after the last class.

### **Distance Education**

More information on distance learning is found on pages 22-23.

### **Distance Education with Tutorial Support**

This is a variation on Distance Education. Students receive the distance material *and* have structured tutorials with their tutor and the other students.

### **Online Courses**

Online courses, blended learning and online supported courses will be offered in 2017.

### **Timetables**

Timetables for all courses are in the back of this prospectus.

### **Recognition of Prior Learning and Cross Credits**

Prior learning from an accredited institute at the same level is recognised by TCI. TCI's Policy on Recognition of Prior Learning and Credit Transfer is available in the Student Manual and at <http://www.tci.ac.nz/admissions-enrolment/policies>.

To apply for recognition of prior learning (RPL) please use the form on our website: <http://www.tci.ac.nz/useful-forms> (also in the Student Manual).

Depending on your previous tertiary study, TCI may credit up to 40% towards a TCI qualification. For previous study to be considered, it must have occurred no more than 10 years ago.

There is an administration fee for processing an RPL application:

RPL for an overseas qualification \$50.00

RPL for a New Zealand qualification \$40.00

There is no charge for cross-credit within TCI or for processing pre-requisites for entry into the NZDCS.

The **Diploma qualifications** are eligible for consideration for RPL into the Bachelor of Theology at Otago University; Good Shepherd College; and at the Catholic Institute of Sydney.

Certificates and Diplomas carry credit points towards the Catholic school system of Certification for teachers.

## INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AT ALL LEVELS

### **Courses for Personal Interest**

TCl is committed to assisting students gain a qualification. However, students who do not wish to undertake a formal qualification may attend courses for personal enrichment. Students in this category are awarded a Certificate of Personal Interest after attending two courses. This is a certificate of attendance only.

### **Attendance at Lectures**

Students are encouraged to attend all lectures and, to meet the course requirements, must attend 15 hours of an 18 hour course. TCl's policy on attendance can be found in the Student Manual. If a lecture is missed, students are encouraged to contact their lecturer to discuss their options.

### **Study, Credits and Levels**

Most of our students study part-time. On average, the Certificate qualifications can be completed in two years of part-time study, while the Diploma qualifications may take up to four years of part-time study. Students can, and are encouraged to, complete these qualifications earlier.

Level 5 courses are usually 10 credits and level 6 courses are 15 credits. A general rule is 1 credit = 10 hours of study (including class time, reading, personal study and writing assessments):

10 credits = 100 study hours

15 credits = 150 study hours

Note: a full-time year of study is equivalent to 120 credits.

### **Class Size**

#### **Minimum Numbers**

All face to face classes with fewer than **six** enrolments will be cancelled two weeks before the course commencement date.

### **Assessment**

Students enrolled in an accredited course are required to complete assessment tasks by the set date. The lecturer may grant an extension if necessary. Procedures on assessment and extensions are available in the Student Manual and on the website.

Students need to complete and attach the Assignment Coversheet before submitting their assignments. A sample of students' work is kept on record for moderation and audit purposes. If you have any questions about this, please contact the Head of Student & Business Support.

### **Assessment in Te Reo Māori**

TCl offers the use of Te Reo Māori in assessment for those students who request it. Students are asked to inform the Head of Student & Business Support of such requests with their application and enrolment prior to the commencement of the course.

### **Textbooks and Course Material**

Students are supplied with a book of readings or access to readings online for all courses. Some courses also have recommended texts. These may be borrowed or purchased.

### **Priority of Students' Claims**

If TCl is unable to meet its commitments regarding courses, a refund will be made to students calculated on a pro rata basis based on the undelivered portion of the course. This provision is currently underwritten by the Catholic Bishops of New Zealand. Refer to: Disclosure of Information to Students 2017 (with this prospectus).

### **Complaints Procedures**

### **Study Loans and Allowances**

## APPLICATION AND ENROLMENT

If you are interested in studying at TCI, you can get more information or enrol by:

1. Contacting TCI by phone, email, website [www.tci.ac.nz](http://www.tci.ac.nz) or visiting a diocesan site. Our staff will assist you to choose the study programme that is right for you.
2. Completing and returning the application/enrolment form available with this prospectus. Applications are accepted throughout the year. **Please ensure you submit your enrolment form together with supporting documentation at least 3 weeks before the start of the first course you wish to study.**

You are encouraged to apply early as this aids TCI's planning. You will be contacted within two weeks of receipt of your application/enrolment to let you know if it has been successful.

First year students **must**:

- complete all sections of the **Application & Enrolment Form 2017**
- sign the form
- provide all necessary documentation, **including a certified copy of proof of NZ or Australian citizenship or permanent residency**

Returning students will receive a **Returning Student Enrolment Form 2017**. If one is not sent to you please request the form from the Registrar. Returning students **must**:

- update any changes to their details on this Enrolment Form
- sign the form
- provide all necessary documentation, **including photographic ID**

The completed form must be returned to the diocesan Site Co-ordinator or, for distance education, to the Registrar.

**Note:** For the Certificate in Leadership in a Catholic School, students are to use a separate enrolment form obtained from the Auckland diocesan office.

Students are **not** required to pay fees with their enrolment. Refer to **Payment of Fees**.

TCI collects and stores information from the enrolment forms to comply with the requirements of the Ministry of Education, the Tertiary Education Commission and NZQA; to manage internal administrative processes, and for planning for the needs of Catholic parishes and schools.

## FEES

TCI fees are lower than those of other educational institutes offering similar qualifications. All information on fees and financial assistance is subject to changes in government policy. There is a compulsory Administrative Fee for all Certificate and Diploma courses (paper). All tuition fees are GST inclusive.

### **Payment of Fees**

All fees are to be paid after the first six hours of classes for taught courses (papers) or two weeks from the start of the semester for Distance Education courses (papers).

### **Withdrawals**

A student withdrawing from a course **within the specified withdrawal period** may apply in writing for a refund of course fees. The withdrawal period for a course/paper towards Certificates and Diplomas **taught face to face** is within the first six hours of teaching. The withdrawal period for all Certificates and Diplomas taught by **Distance Education** is one month from the start of the semester. A withdrawal form is available from the Registrar or the Site Co-ordinator. Refunds will be calculated on a pro rata basis. Students who withdraw early must return the Course Readers/Books or the full fee for the course may be charged.

Students need to ensure that they become familiar with TCI's policy and procedures on withdrawal and refunds. This is available in the **Disclosure of Information to Students** document included with this Prospectus. Further assistance may be obtained from the Head of Student & Business Support.



## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### CHANGES TO QUALIFICATIONS

The New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) directed all tertiary education providers of non-degree certificates and diplomas in New Zealand in a targeted review of qualifications. TCI, as a provider of theological certificates and diplomas, has been included in this review.

The review for the theological sector is now complete and there are new qualifications on the National Qualifications Framework for certificates and diplomas in Christian Studies. The new qualifications will be offered by TCI from 2017 onwards.

#### What does this mean for TCI?

At present, the NZQA registered qualifications available at TCI have been developed by TCI and are specific to TCI. The new qualifications will be New Zealand Certificates and New Zealand Diplomas and will be available at other theological institutes. TCI has developed programmes of study to match the new qualifications and has applied to NZQA for registration of the new programmes of study. The current (old) qualifications offered by TCI will be taken off the National Qualifications Framework at the beginning of 2019. Although they are no longer on the NQF, they remain valid, accredited qualifications.

TCI has applied to NZQA to register programmes of study and approval to teach the following:

#### **New Zealand Certificate in Christian Studies** (Level 5) with strands in:

- Christian Ministry (60 credits)
- Religious Education (80 credits)

And

#### **New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies** (Level 6; 120 credits) with strands in:

- Christian Leadership
- Religious Studies
- Theological Studies
- Pastoral Ministry

A full description of the new qualifications will be available on the TCI website ([www.tci.ac.nz/programmes](http://www.tci.ac.nz/programmes)) when TCI obtains NZQA approval.

#### What does this mean for current students?

For 2017, current students will **continue with the programmes of study** in which they are enrolled. When the new qualifications are available, students may

- transfer to a new qualification
- or continue with the qualification they enrolled in originally

Students will have until the end of 2018 to complete a current (old) qualification; if this time is insufficient, please contact the Head of Student & Business Support. Students can be assured that they will not be disadvantaged in the transition.

### Scripture

**The Course Materials for all Scripture courses are the Bible and Course Reader.**

#### **SC501 UNDERSTANDING THE OLD TESTAMENT**

##### **SC101 INTRODUCTION TO THE OLD TESTAMENT**

Level 5, 10 Credits

Written over a long period of time, the Old Testament describes God's relationship with the Hebrew people. Who were these people? What was this relationship about? When did it happen? This course will introduce participants to the key events, dates, places and people of the Old Testament.

#### **SC502 INTERPRETING THE NEW TESTAMENT**

##### **SC102 INTRODUCTION TO THE NEW TESTAMENT**

Level 5, 10 Credits

The New Testament was written by a number of people in the light of faith in the Resurrection using a variety of literary forms. This course is designed to familiarise participants with the content and world of the New Testament.

#### **SC602 GOSPEL OF MATTHEW**

##### **SC202 GOSPEL OF MATTHEW**

Level 6, 15 Credits

Matthew's Gospel was written for a community desperately needing a sense of identity with the past and direction for facing an uncertain future. This course will examine the content and structure of the Gospel in the light of this understanding.

#### **SC604 GOSPEL OF JOHN**

##### **SC204 GOSPEL OF JOHN**

Level 6, 15 Credits

The Gospel of John shows us Jesus as the Word of God made flesh who has come into the world to continue the work of God. In this course, students will deepen their knowledge and understanding of the background, significant stylistic features, theology, major characters and themes of this Gospel.

#### **SC608 WOMEN IN THE NEW TESTAMENT**

##### **SC208 WOMEN IN THE NEW TESTAMENT**

Level 6, 15 Credits

The New Testament shows clearly that women led the way in faith and discipleship. By examining the texts of the New Testament, participants will be introduced to characters who may have been overlooked in traditional presentations.

#### **SC610 THE PENTATEUCH**

##### **SC210 THE PENTATEUCH**

Level 6, 15 Credits

The Pentateuch, the "Five Books of Moses" (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy), is also known as the "Torah" or "Law". It is of primary importance in the Jewish canon of Scripture. This course presents an overall view of the books, their content, structure and origin.

#### **SC612 LETTERS OF PAUL (New)**

Level 6, 15 Credits

The Letters of Paul arose from the real needs of his audience as well as the triumphs and tribulation of his ministry. This course will examine the historical circumstances that gave rise to the letters and explore the use of Paul's writings in contemporary liturgical settings as they speak to the Church of today.

#### **SC635 BIBLICAL THEMES AND MODELS FOR LEADERSHIP**

##### **SC335 BIBLICAL THEMES AND MODELS FOR LEADERSHIP**

Level 6, 15 Credits

Building upon the introductory Scripture courses, this course will explore several significant biblical themes relevant to leadership such as: call, covenant, reign of God and community. It will also consider the person of Jesus and various other biblical men and women from a leadership perspective.



**The course material for all Theology courses is the Course Reader unless otherwise stated.**

### **TH501 WHAT CATHOLICS BELIEVE**

#### TH101 INTRODUCTION TO CATHOLICISM

Level 5, 10 Credits

What are the key distinguishing characteristics of Catholicism? How are they expressed today? In considering these questions, this course aims to provide useful background for those interested in exploring the question of Catholic identity.

### **TH502 WHAT IS THEOLOGY?**

#### TH102 INTRODUCTION TO THEOLOGY

Level 5, 10 Credits

Theology is “faith seeking understanding”. This course will explore questions about God, Jesus Christ, creation and being human in light of scripture, tradition and experience. Students will be encouraged to see themselves as both experiencing and receiving theology.

### **TH503 CHURCH AND SACRAMENTS**

#### TH103 HISTORY OF THE SACRAMENTS

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course will give an overview of the major historical changes and developments that have influenced our understanding and practice of the sacraments. This in turn will help students to better understand the issues relating to sacraments today.

**Course Text:** Martos, J. (2001). *Doors to the Sacred*.

### **TH506 MĀORI SPIRITUALITY- HE RAU TOROA I (New)**

Level 5, 10 Credits

Using a Catholic perspective, students will explore how concepts and values central to Māori culture are an integral part of the formation of spiritualities that express the unique context of Aotearoa New Zealand.

### **TH505 ISSUES IN CHRISTIAN ETHICS**

#### TH110 INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN MORALITY

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course will examine the key principles underlying Christian ethics and will introduce students to some of the different approaches to moral decision-making.

### **TH601 SACRAMENTS TODAY**

#### TH201/RE200 UNDERSTANDING SACRAMENTS

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will give an overview of the theological understanding of the sacraments today and help participants view the sacraments more critically, renewing their own approach to and understanding of them.

### **TH602 THE PERSON AND WORK OF JESUS**

#### TH202/RE200 AN INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTOLOGY

Level 6, 15 Credits

As Christians, we are heirs to a profoundly rich history. For some two thousand years, Christians have been struggling to come to terms with the Jesus we recognise as Christ, Lord and Saviour. This course will examine some of that history as it invites participants to answer for themselves Jesus' question, “Who do you say I am?”

### **TH603 RENEWING THE CHURCH**

#### TH203 UNDERSTANDING CHURCH

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course looks at the Catholic Church's understanding of itself from the time of the Second Vatican Council, particularly as expressed in the document *The Constitution on the Church (Lumen gentium)*.

### **TH604 THE LITURGICAL YEAR**

#### TH204 THE LITURGICAL YEAR

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will look at the Church's annual liturgical cycle with special focus on the liturgical seasons. It will increase student's appreciation for the importance of liturgy in the formation of all the baptised.

### **TH606a THE EARLY CHURCH**

TH206a/RE200 CHURCH HISTORY: THE EARLY AGES

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will examine the exciting rise of the Church within the culture of the Roman Empire. It will trace the controversies and theological arguments especially the debates concerning Jesus. It is in this period that we can see how the structure of the church developed.

### **TH606c THE REFORMATION**

TH206c/RE200 CHURCH HISTORY: THE REFORMATION PERIOD

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course looks at the early modern period which was a time of turmoil and reforms. It will discuss the Protestant Reformation(s) and the events that led up to the 'Counter-Reformation' and the Council of Trent. Areas covered include theology, spirituality and attitudes to new scientific learning.

### **TH611 CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING II**

TH211 CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING II

Level 6, 15 Credits

It is the vocation of the laity to advance the reign of God by transforming society. This course will explain the Church's social teaching. Students will gain the knowledge and understanding necessary in order to apply the Church's teaching with confidence to the issues of the day.

### **TH619 MĀORI SPIRITUALITY- HE RAU TOROA II**

TH219/RE200 MĀORI SPIRITUALITY - HE RAU TAROA

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will assist students to deepen their understanding of being Christian in the bicultural context of Aotearoa New Zealand through an exploration of concepts and values central to Māori spirituality.

### **TH631 CATHOLIC SPIRITUAL TRADITION**

TH231 CATHOLIC SPIRITUAL TRADITION

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course introduces students to the major contributors, movements and contexts associated with Christian spirituality. Students will discover the historical developments in the Christian spiritual tradition and examine ecumenical and Māori spirituality in Aotearoa New Zealand from a Catholic perspective.

### **TH633 VALUES AND ETHICS IN PASTORAL LEADERSHIP**

LD/PM333 VALUES AND ETHICS IN PASTORAL LEADERSHIP

Level 6, 15 Credits

Technological developments are becoming integrated into and changing our social practices and institutions, including sexuality, marriage and family life. This course will help students to engage with some of the pastoral issues that people face today from the beginning of life through to the end of life.

### **TH636 LEADERSHIP IN THE NEW ZEALAND CHURCH**

TH236 THE NZ CHURCH; LEADERSHIP IN CONTEXT

Level 6, 15 Credits

Students will explore the tradition and history of the New Zealand Church with a view to being able to exercise leadership in a biculturally sensitive way.

## Religious Education

### **TH336 SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH**

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course examines the key ideas associated with the theology and practice of the Catholic sacraments and significant aspects of their historical development. These relate to parish celebrations of the Sunday Eucharist and other sacraments.

**The Course Material for all Religious Education courses is the Course Reader unless otherwise stated.**

### **RE501 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION TODAY**

RE101 INTRODUCTION TO RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course will introduce participants to the philosophy of the Catholic school, the role of the teacher, the principles, general aims, contexts, teaching approaches, assessment and language of Religious Education by examining the Religious Education Curriculum Statements for Catholic primary and secondary schools.

**Course Material:** Course Reader; NCRS Curriculum documents

## **RE502 SPIRITUALITY FOR TEACHERS**

### **RE102 INTRODUCTION TO SPIRITUALITY FOR TEACHERS**

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course will provide an opportunity for participants to explore the meaning of spirituality and ways of nourishing their own spirituality. Practical suggestions for helping children develop their spirituality will be offered.

## **RE503 TEACHING PRACTICE**

### **TE101 TEACHING EXPERIENCE**

Level 5, 20 Credits

Students undertake teaching practice in a Catholic School to experience the life of a Catholic Community, share the role of teacher of Religious Education and lead class prayer. A requirement for teacher trainee students doing the NZCCS-RE (undertaken on placement in a Catholic primary or secondary school).

## **RE504 TEACHING IN A CATHOLIC SCHOOL (New)**

Level 5, 20 Credits

This course draws on current writings and the experience of the participants to examine the life of a Catholic school community. It is a capstone paper where students will integrate, synthesise, and apply their knowledge and skills to examine the identity and mission of Catholic Schools. In service course.

## **RE601 WHAT MAKES A SCHOOL CATHOLIC?**

### **RE201 WHAT MAKES A SCHOOL CATHOLIC**

Level 6, 15 Credits

What makes a school Catholic? What is meant by “special character”? What is the role of teachers, Boards of Trustees and others, in maintaining and enhancing the Catholic character of a school? This course draws on Church documents, other current writings and the experience of the participants to provide some answers to these and related questions.

## Pastoral Ministry

## **PM501 PRAYER AND LITURGY**

### **PM102 INTRODUCTION TO LITURGY**

Level 5, 10 Credits

Using an experiential teaching method, the aim of this course is to look at the theory and principles of liturgy and how these can be adapted to practical situations that relate to the everyday liturgical practice of the Church.

## **PM502 SPIRITUALITY FOR MINISTRY**

### **PMH102 INTRODUCTION TO SPIRITUALITY FOR PASTORAL MINISTRY IN A HOSPITAL CONTEXT and**

### **PMP102 INTRODUCTION TO SPIRITUALITY FOR PASTORAL MINISTRY IN A PRISON CONTEXT and**

### **YM102 INTRODUCTION TO SPIRITUALITY FOR CATHOLIC YOUTH MINISTRY**

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course will provide an opportunity for participants to explore the meaning of spirituality and ways of nourishing it in their own lives. It will also provide participants with practical suggestions for appropriate prayer with individuals and groups in ministry.

## **PM503 MISSION AND MINISTRY**

### **PM101 CHURCH AND MINISTRY**

Level 5, 10 Credits

This course examines different understandings of Church, with special emphasis on the “Community of Disciples” or “Communio” model. The significance of liturgy, the meaning of mission and ecumenism, and the role of ministers, ordained and lay, are some of the issues explored.

## **PM504 PASTORAL MINISTRY PRAXIS**

### **PE101 EXPERIENCE IN MINISTRY**

Level 5, 12 Credits

This course provides participants with an understanding of the basic principles and skills of pastoral ministry in the Catholic tradition, and to give them an opportunity to reflect on how these apply in a specific pastoral context by undertaking a supervised pastoral ministry project.

## **PM505 CATHOLIC YOUTH MINISTRY**

### **YM101 INTRODUCTION TO CATHOLIC YOUTH MINISTRY**

Level 5, 10 Credits

Through an examination of *A Framework for Catholic Ministry with Young People in Aotearoa New Zealand*, this course will introduce participants to the goals, themes and components of Catholic Youth Ministry.

**PM506 YOUTH MINISTRY PRACTICE**

## YM103 YOUTH MINISTRY EXPERIENCE

Level 5, 10 Credits

The Youth Ministry Practice is an opportunity to experience the life of the Catholic faith community and to actively participate as a leader in ministry with young people. It is a chance to further explore the role of the youth minister.

**PM602 CELEBRATING LITURGY**

## PM 202 CELEBRATING LITURGY

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will examine in some depth the many dimensions that are essential to a more extensive research of liturgy. Both theoretical and practical in delivery, the course will examine Vatican Council II and the renewal of the liturgy, the purpose of the Scripture in worship, the Eucharist, Church art and architecture, various rites and a more detailed look at some of the main ministries in our liturgical celebrations as well as the role of the liturgy committee.

**PM603 RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)**

## PM203 RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Level 6, 15 Credits

The aim of this course is to give participants an appreciation of the RCIA as a process rather than a programme. It will explore the key elements of each period and stage of the RCIA, as well as possible ways of on-going development.

**LD/PM631 LEADERSHIP AND MINISTRY**

## LD/PM331 LEADERSHIP AND MINISTRY

Level 6, 15 Credits

This course will explore the influence a Christian world view has on the way people enter the leadership process. It will examine the nature of the organisation where people do leadership and consider how doing leadership within the parish context can constitute ministry.

## LD/PM334 PASTORAL LEADERSHIP IN SYNTHESIS

Level 6, 15 Credits

The aim of this paper is to bring together the different learning from the academic and practical components of the Diploma in Pastoral Leadership Programme. Various themes will be identified and students will be asked to apply their insights to different scenarios. It will also provide an opportunity to explore the Church and leadership of the future.

**Unit for the Master of Educational Leadership****ELRE680 Christian Spirituality and Religious Education in Aotearoa New Zealand**

This unit will challenge those in religious leadership positions and religious educators to articulate a theologically sound Christian spirituality in the context of Aotearoa New Zealand today. It will explore the meaning of the term 'spirituality' and key movements in the history of Christian spirituality; consider the impact of Vatican II on spirituality and the challenge that social media presents to contemporary spirituality; and finally, evaluate the place of Spirituality / charism in Catholic school identity.
